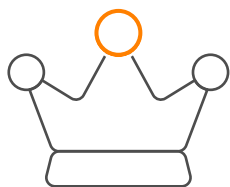

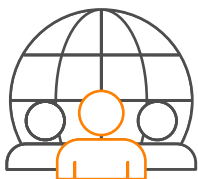

Adapt or die

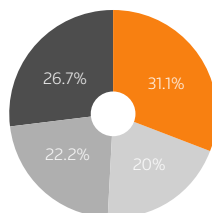
The legal industry has demonstrated it's capable to adapt. In the long-term those that adopt technology will thrive.



Collaborative is key

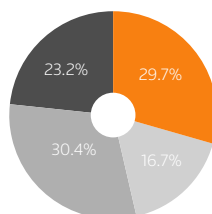

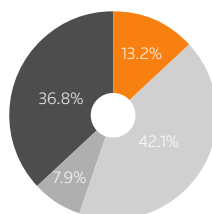
